### The Challenge Of Christmas

*Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who...emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant...He humbled Himself... excerpts from Philippians 2:5-8*

Philippians 2:5-8 is the Apostle Paul's retelling of the Christmas story. Jesus, though He was God, equal in essence to God the Father, willingly took on the limitations of a human nature in order to be our Savior. The zinger is the way Paul introduces this passage--***have this attitude in yourselves***. Paul challenges us to imitate Jesus in His self-emptying, humble, servanthood.

Even our secular culture gets this. Thanksgiving through Christmas is known as "the season of giving". It's the time of year for toy drives, serving meals at the rescue mission and donating to charity. People who don't believe in Jesus have a sense that at Christmastime, they should do some kind of selfless act to benefit others.

For us, this is not to be a month-long aberration in an otherwise selfish life, but an everyday occurrence. The challenge of Christmas is to imitate Jesus in developing a **lifestyle** of service. How can you order your life so that you'll be living a Christmas lifestyle all year long?



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
