Are You A "Person In Need"?

Normally I don't like the new "politically correct" titles people give to things. What good comes from calling a homeless person an "Outdoor Citizen"? The fact is, they are still homeless. There is one politically correct title I do like though. Instead of using terms like "poor" or "needy", the new politically correct term is "people in need".

I like that expression because it helps level the playing field between those who give and those who receive help. The fact is we are all "people in need". Jesus once told a group of self-righteous Pharisees, *It is not those who are well who need a physician, but those who are sick. I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance.* (Luke 5:31-32). The truth is that none of us is righteous before God on our own merits (Romans 3:10). Everyone is a sinner in need of a Savior. As Christians we have accepted this fact and placed our trust in Jesus to be that Savior. Therefore we should be very comfortable identifying ourselves as "people in need".

Paul had to rebuke the prideful Corinthian church by asking, *For who regards you as superior?* The embarrassing answer for the Corinthians was that **they** were the **only** ones that considered themselves superior. Everyone else knew that they were ordinary forgiven sinners like the rest of us. Paul went on to remind them, *What do you have that you did not receive? And if you did receive it, why do you boast as if you had not received it?* (1 Cor. 4:7) We would do well to keep our own needy condition in mind the next time we have the privilege of helping another person in need.



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
