For two weeks this past November I used a little booklet I had written called Servant's Journal for my daily devotions. I did it to prepare spiritually for a service opportunity I was going to participate in with one of our Love INC Network Churches in mid-December. At the end of each day's devotional was a place to write down ways I had been able to apply the lesson. It just so happened that part of this two week period fell during Thanksgiving week. During the weekend of that Thanksgiving Holiday, my family was treated to an all-expenses-paid stay at a posh resort in Southern California.

The final devotion in the Servant's Journal asks the participant to reflect on what they learned during the previous two weeks.
