While on a prayer retreat I sat on the shore of Tomales Bay watching 4 kayakers paddling towards the ocean. Upon closer observation I realized that while there were 4 kayakers, there were only three kayaks. Two people were paddling together in a two seat kayak. The Lord put it on my heart that this was a picture of my life as a Christian, two people, me and Jesus, sharing one life. (Paul uses marriage to illustrate this same truth in Ephesians 5:22-33).
